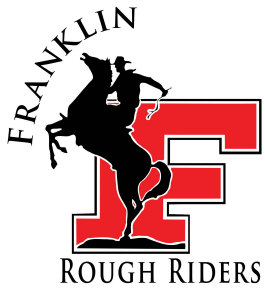

May is always a busy time of the year but also a fun time of the year. Families are busy with Spring activities and the school has many scheduled activities for the students.

On Saturday, May 7th the student council is holding a walk for Mrs. Tregoning to help in her fight with cancer. The walk will take place at the Kent Roosevelt track from 8:30-11:30. Students should have already brought home pledge sheets to help raise money for Mrs. Tregoning's enormous medical bills. We hope to see you at the track.

We will be holding two awards assemblies again this school year. The 3rd and 4th grade students will have their awards assembly on Thursday, May 26th beginning at 1:30 in our gym. At 1:00 there will be a short assembly for our K-2 students to honor our Lions Award winners. All parents whose child will be receiving a Lions Award will be notified through the mail. The 5th grade awards assembly will take place on Wednesday, June 1 beginning with breakfast at 8:45. The 5th grade assembly will involve breakfast for the parents and students and the awards assembly will begin at 9:15. An r.s.v.p. will be sent home with your child for the 5th grade breakfast. All parents are welcome to attend but please remember to use our parking lot first before we spill over into the golf course lot. There should be plenty of room in the back of the building and in the grass area before we have to use the golf course. Please understand that not all students will be able to receive an award. Students will be receiving awards for academics, attendance, P.E., art, music, band, orchestra, peer mediators, student council, and safety patrol. Students being recognized for their academics during the school year will be receiving medals. I understand that it is hard to get off work to attend the assemblies. If you want to know if your child will be receiving an award you can email me or call me. We will be putting the lists together during the next two weeks.

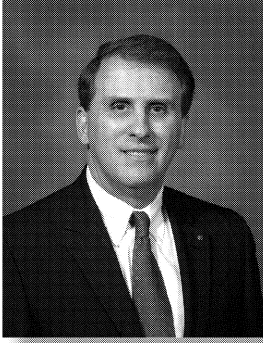

Dear Kent Community Members,

At this time of year, we think of the rite of spring as a rebirth, a reawakening. We reclaim from Old Man Winter what's ours in our yards, our flowers, and our trees. Spring is a new beginning in nature's cycle.

Ironically, in schools, the rite of spring is a completion, a wrapping-up. Our students are concluding their school year with a battery of tests, to include the Ohio Achievement Assessments (OAA) in elementary and middle schools and the Ohio Graduation Test (OGT) in high school. Each year, we anticipate increases in our test results. We anticipate and hope for *excellent* results this year!

Zero Waste at Franklin Elementary

Sustainability for Educators and the Environment (SEE) has taken on the issue of waste within the Kent City Schools. The SEE mission is to educate students about sustainability principles and to support the practical application of these principles in K-12 schools. This includes the SEE Zero Waste Initiative. Zero Waste strategies consider the entire life-cycle of a product; maximizing recycling, minimizing waste, reducing consumption and ensuring that products are made to be reused, repaired or recycled back into nature or the marketplace. Franklin is just one of many schools in NE Ohio participating in the SEE Zero Waste Initiative.

What's Happening?

SEE staff members conducted waste audits to determine what type of garbage Franklin pays to dispose of every day. By sorting and measuring what is thrown away, SEE can determine where to focus waste reduction efforts. One of the largest categories of garbage at schools is always food waste. For the past year Franklin Elementary students have been separating their fruit and vegetable scraps into buckets after lunch. From there the scraps are taken to the compost bin behind the school. Compost generated can be utilized in the school gardens on site.

Franklin Elementary, along with other Kent City Schools, has also joined the Recycle Across America campaign to standardize recycling bin signage. The campaign is aimed at "making recycling more simple, comprehensive, efficient and prevalent in the United States". Franklin already recycles paper, plastic, and aluminum and adopting such signage could make a massive difference to recycling rates.

What Can You Do?

Begin to adopt a zero waste mindset at home by packing your child's lunch in reusable containers, their drinks in reusable bottles, and putting it all in a reusable lunch box. You can also encourage your child to take home their untouched food. SEE staff is constantly amazed — and you would be too — to discover how much untouched food is found in the garbage. On average SEE has found that 5% of school garbage by weight consists of unopened, prepackaged food, 30% is wasted food, and 7% is liquid, mostly milk. That's a lot of food and it happens in every school, every day! But, garbage is something each and every one of us can do something about on a daily basis, simply by starting the conversation and by being mindful of how we manage our daily lunch.
