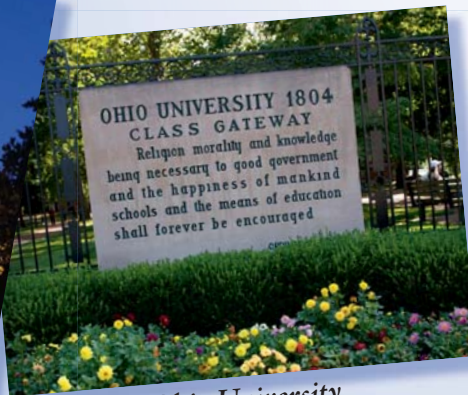

For baccalaureate college admission, the sixteen stated units are required. Students may be admitted with one or two deficiencies and they will be given the opportunity to complete these deficiencies while enrolled.

## SELECTION CRITERIA FOR FALL TERM:

Admission to selective programs will remain very competitive and many programs have early application deadlines. Freshmen may be admitted directly into baccalaureate programs with the expectation that the "core" requirements are presented. Specific course

requirements vary with the college the student wishes to enter. In several cases, there are requirements in addition to the "core." Admission to the two-year colleges is "open" in most areas of study.

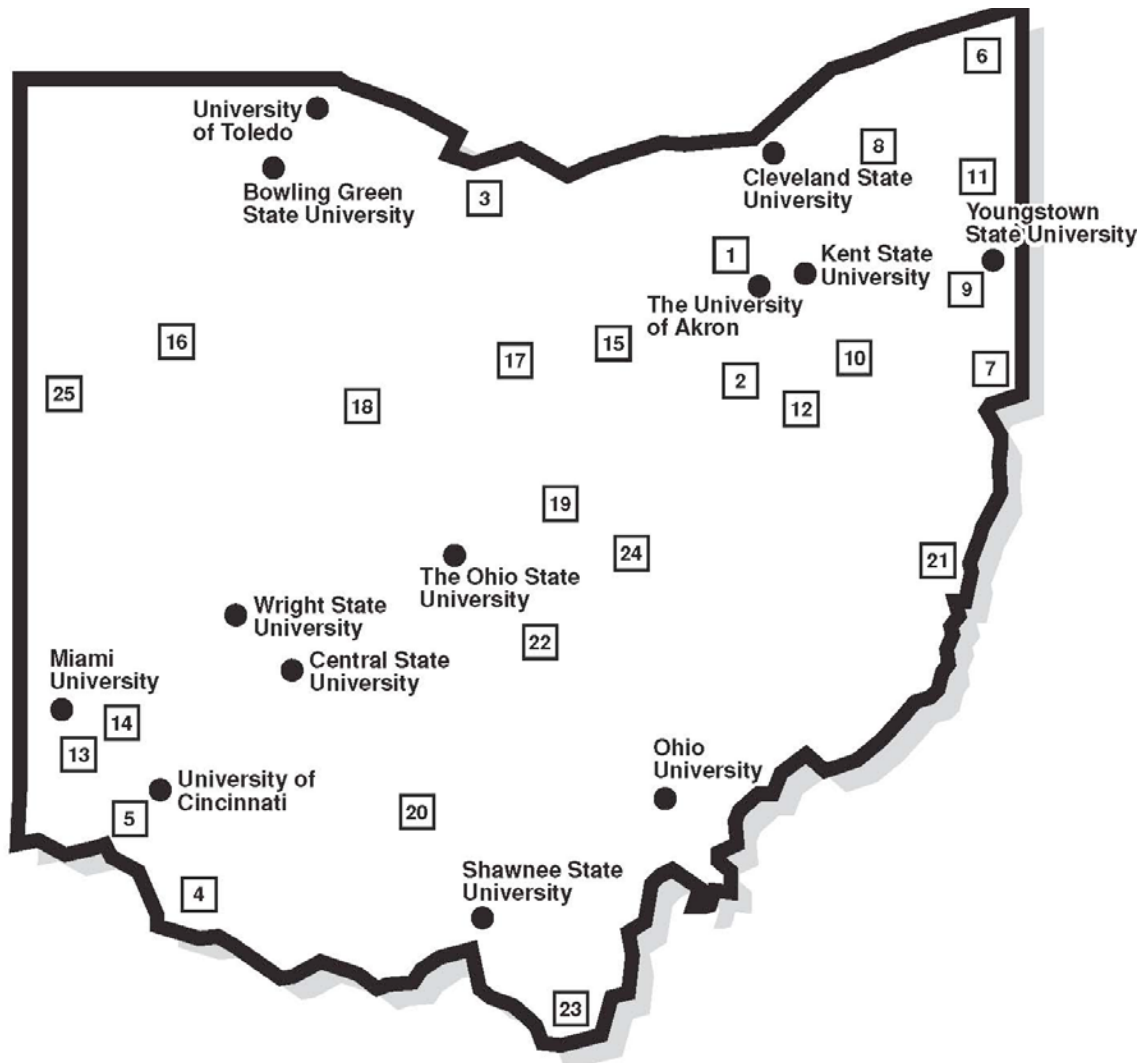
