FACULTY AND COUNSELING SERVICES

Faculty: 110; 85 with Masters Degree or beyond and 2 PhDs.

The Guidance Department provides a comprehensive program that addresses the academic, career and personal/social development of all students. The staff includes four full time counselors and three full time support staff. In addition, services of a full-time School Psychologist and a Student Assistance Counselor are available.

CAREER EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Theodore Roosevelt High School is a member of the Six District Educational Compact (SDEC). The SDEC offers 25 career-technical programs. All SDEC programs, with the exception of auto specialization, provide opportunity for students to earn College Tech Prep status. College Tech Prep is a infrastructure that provides students with a program of study in a career pathway that incorporates academics, technical skills and career-related courses aligned with postsecondary education. TRHS has eleven career-technical programs that equip students for high-skill, high-wage careers demanded in a competitive economy, including: Athletic Healthcare and Fitness; Business Management; Computer Aided Design and Manufacturing; Construction Technologies; Cosmetology; Electronics, Robotics, Programming; Engineering Academy; Forestry and Landscape Management; Health Careers Technologies; Marketing Management; Teaching Professions.

DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY INFORMATION

Theodore Roosevelt High School is widely respected for its established traditions of academic excellence and co-curricular activities. The first class graduated in 1869. Roosevelt is a comprehensive public school that is part of a Six District Career Education Compact. The city is the largest in Portage County and is home of Kent State University. The diversity of our student body enhances and enriches our educational environment. This is a community with a reputation for consistently supporting education.

SCHOOL CHARACTERISTICS

Theodore Roosevelt High School is recognized as a School of Excellence by the State Ohio

Enrollment: 1071 plus 213 Six District Educational Compact students, with 298 in the senior class

Accreditation: North Central Accrediting Association and Ohio Department of Education

Schedule: Classes meet 51 minutes per day, 5 days per week, 18 weeks per semester.

CURRICULUM

About 85% of the student body is enrolled in college preparatory, advanced and AP classes of which 25% participate in career education programs. The remaining 15% are in general or special needs programs.

Thirteen Advanced Placement courses are offered.

Students may enroll in college courses through Kent State, Akron and other Universities through the College Credit Plus Program. Special needs programs are offered to accommodate all IDEA disability categories.

ACADEMY PROGRAMS

Expedition Academy is based on a model developed by Harvard University and Outward Bound. It seeks to create an alternative learning experience through the integration of English, history, physical education and health with outdoor skills and community service. This is a college preparatory academy.

Bridges Academy serves as a link between middle school and high school experiences to help ensure student success. Teaching teams share a 150 minute block and adjust courses to meet student needs through small group or individualized instruction and a project-based approach. The low student-teacher ratio focuses on building strong student-teacher relationships.

SERVICE ORIENTED COURSEWORK

Riders Taking Action is a senior course that fosters effective community leadership through the action of service and scholarship. Students learn the rationale behind their service and discover how to best approach its implementation.

Leadership Planning Committee is intended for experienced leaders to be an integral part of a team to design and implement a yearly leadership-training program for Roosevelt High School students. This 3-day retreat is held in November with a service project component afterward.

CLASS RANK

GPA is computed on the basis of all classes taken, other than pass/fail courses. A student's rank is weighted slightly for credits earned with an extra point awarded for each AP class. An index number is used for ranking. Index number = 25 x gpa + total credits + AP extra points. Students may apply no more than one additional credit each year earned outside the regular school day.
