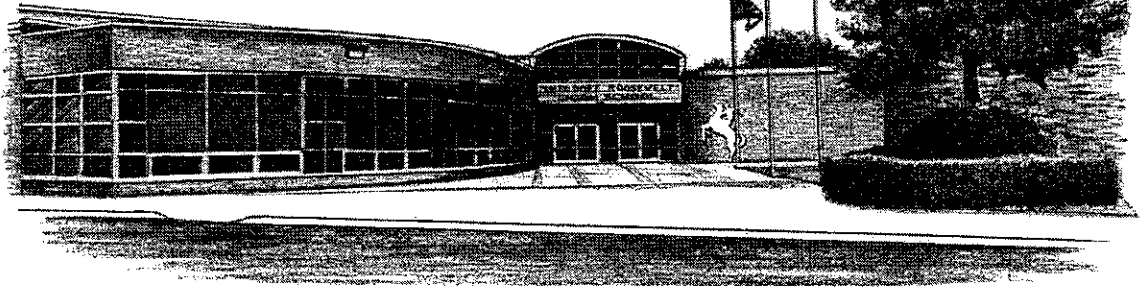

**DRIVER EDUCATION INFORMATION AND REGISTRATION FORM 2011-12**

National Driver Training School offers Driver Education as part of our Kent Community Education program. All students, including those who are home-schooled or attend other schools, are welcome to enroll. The Kent Community Education Office is located at Roosevelt High School in Room 515. All students participating in Driver Education are responsible to the Kent City School District Student Conduct Code.

Each 3-week session meets six times for classroom instruction-Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4:45 P.M. through 9:00 P.M. in Room 506 at Roosevelt. Students then individually schedule their 8 hours of "behind-the-wheel" instruction directly with National Driver Training School at (440)248-8552. The 24 hours of classroom instruction and 8 hours "behind-the-wheel" instructions are required by law.

Students must be 15 years and 5 months of age to attend the classroom and 15 years and 6 months for the "behind-the-wheel" instruction. This is the law.

The fee for each session is \$320.00 payable by check, cash, credit card, or money order to Kent Community Education. **Master Card, Visa, and Discover Credit Cards will be accepted. Credit Card payment will be made to National Driving and processed by our office.** Payment in full is required prior to the first day of class. Please read all dates carefully for your session to be sure that the dates do not interfere with your co-curricular activities. No refunds will be issued after the first class session. If school is canceled due to emergency for the school day, i.e., weather, Driver Training class is postponed. The minimum number of students to hold a class each session is five.

### **SENIOR CLASS NEWS**

Parents of seniors who were unable to attend the Senior Parent Guidance Information Night on Wednesday, September 21<sup>st</sup> with Mr. Kline can call the Guidance Office for the information packet made available that evening.

### **JUNIOR CLASS NEWS**

On September 28<sup>th</sup>, Junior parents met with Mrs. Bubenzer for the Junior Parent College Information Night. Parents and students bound for a two or four year college were given important information that will help them make the right choices when the time comes to further their education. If you were unable to attend this special presentation and are interested in receiving the information packet, please stop in the Guidance Office for an information packet.

On **OCTOBER 15<sup>TH</sup>** TRHS will administer the PSAT/NMSQT. The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test is a great practice test for the SAT, but more importantly, for our current juniors, it is the qualifying scholarship test to be named a National Merit Finalist. All juniors are **STRONGLY** encouraged to take this test along with **SOPHOMORES** planning to pursue college. This is an excellent practice test for the SAT.

Registration for the PSAT/NMSQT test will begin on October 3<sup>rd</sup> and go through Thursday, October 13<sup>th</sup>. The cost of the test is \$20.00. Please make checks payable to Theodore Roosevelt and pay through the Treasurer (Mrs. Pifer) in the main office. A junior who has an athletic event scheduled the morning of the test, or is observing a religious holiday, should see Mr. Kline or Mrs. Bubenzer to arrange for an alternate test date.

### **SOPHOMORE CLASS NEWS**

On Wednesday, October 12<sup>th</sup>, sophomore parents should plan to spend time with Mrs. Deb Rutzky to learn more about how you can help guide your sophomore in their career planning and future educational opportunities as juniors and seniors at RHS, as well as following high school. The program will begin at 7:00 p.m. in the auditorium. Mark your calendars now!!!

**WHAT IS THE PSAT/NMSQT?** Sophomores planning to pursue college will be encouraged to register and take the PSAT/NMSQT test on Saturday, October 15<sup>th</sup>. The PSAT is an excellent practice test for the SAT as well as the competitive test for awarding national merit scholarships! The cost is \$20.00 and students may register for the test between October 3<sup>rd</sup> and October 13<sup>th</sup>.

**WHAT IS THE PLAN TEST?** It is an excellent practice test for the ACT. More importantly, the PLAN test helps students and schools begin early monitoring of a student's academic performance to make sure they are on target for college and career readiness. This year, we are pleased to announce that all tenth graders will take the PLAN test on Wednesday, November 9<sup>th</sup>, as part of our district's efforts to help insure all RHS students are well-prepared for their futures. All sophomores will be bused to Kent State University to take the test in the Governance Chambers located in the Student Center. Students with last names that begin with A – L will be tested in the morning and those whose last names begin with M – Z will be tested in the afternoon.

### **FRESHMAN CLASS NEWS**

Freshman class parents are invited to an informal program "High School Basics: Freshman Success 101" at 7:00 p.m. on October 26<sup>th</sup> in Richard Roberts Auditorium. Parents can meet with Mr. Aaron Carlton, the freshman guidance counselor, to provide a framework for planning the next four years of high school to help support or launch a student's educational and career options following graduation. Course and program scheduling, high school grading and academic records, state testing, college testing opportunities and programs, etc., will be discussed followed with your questions and concerns.

### **OHIO GRADUATION TESTING**

The Ohio Graduation Test will be administered the week of October 24<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> to juniors and seniors in need of passing one or more parts of the test. Students will be notified to report to the high school auditorium to re-take the test(s) they need according to the following schedule: Monday-Reading; Tuesday-Math; Wednesday-Writing; Thursday-Science and Friday-Social Studies.

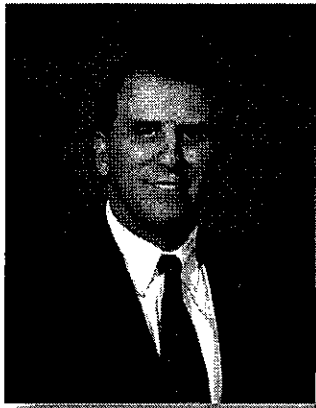

# UPDATE

News for Kent parents from Superintendent Joe Giancola

October, 2011

Dear Kent Parents, Students, and Friends,

I am pleased to announce another successful opening of schools in Kent. Students arrived with energy, enthusiasm for learning, and an expectation of hard work waiting for them in our classrooms. I welcome any suggestions that you have to improve our opening day and a new school year.

On a different note, I must announce some tragic news. After a long battle with Lou Gehrig's disease, Davey Elementary Teacher **Cathy M. Shipley** has passed away this past month. For those of you who did not know her well, allow me to say that Cathy was a wonderful friend, colleague, and teacher who gave 24 years of her life to Kent school children. Over the years, she earned the respect of everyone around her, including our students, all staff members, and parents.

As you may recall, Cathy received the 2011 **Dr. Emilio d. Ferrara** Community Service Award and was recognized by family and friends at our May board meeting. More recently, she was recognized by the Kent School staff at our staff convocation on August 22 for the same award.

Cathy's contributions to the Kent Schools community are best summarized in the reprint of language in the Kent Board of Education's resolution, taken on May 10, 2011.

"THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Kent City School District, Portage County, Ohio, that the Dr. Emilio D. Ferrara Community Service Award is hereby awarded to **CATHERINE MARY SHIPLEY**, elementary teacher in the Kent City Schools, for her volunteer work in the Kent community.

"Catherine Mary Shipley is recognized not only for her 24 years of service as an elementary teacher at Central and Davey Elementary Schools, but also for her commitment to her family and her community; her volunteer work as a peer coach in Essential Elements of Instruction (EEI) training, volunteer organizer of data collection teams for the Standard Bearer process and as a mentor working with Entry Year Teachers (EYT) in the Kent City Schools for more than 15 years; her extra work as a Student Council Advisor, After-School Tutor, Grade-Level Chairperson, tutor in the Extended School Year Program (ESY), teacher in the K-8 summer school program, and K-8 Summer School Coordinator; her initiative to help start the St. Pat's All-Sports Boosters where she spearheaded gift card sales, organized golf outings and served as Vice-President and Treasurer; her volunteer service as a coach of the St. Pat's volleyball team and track team and with other fundraising efforts at the church; and finally volunteer worker in the kitchen at St. Pat's Church on Thursday nights."

In Cathy's honor, I ask you all to consider what she and all staff members have done for our Kent students. Her commitment to making a difference in the lives of our children will be remembered always.
