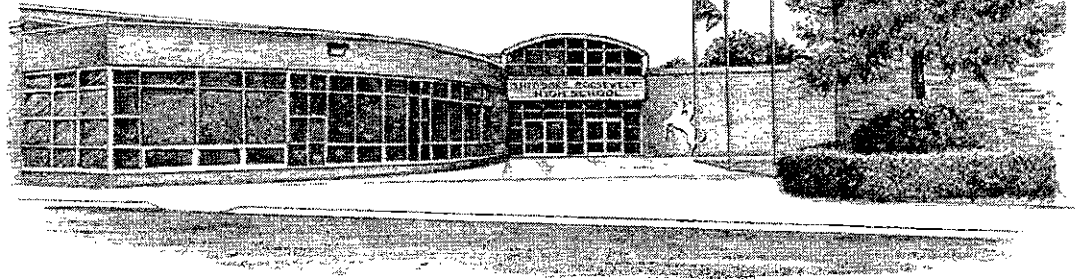

Dear Friends,

May 2008

My announcement, I later found out from a group of students, came as no surprise! They had also noticed a blatant disregard by some students of the dress code with the arrival of warmer weather. This was especially true with some of our young ladies who were just overexposed, so to speak. We had noticed the trend beginning about a week before. The strategy was to let the students self-regulate the situation with conversations with their peers and the adults in the building. When that did not yield results, and the shorts and skirts continued rising with the temperature, we had to address it directly!

Well the good news, in the short run (no pun intended), is our students have adjusted their dress. In my announcement I reminded them how visitors to our school have always commented on how well groomed and appropriately dressed our students were. I was careful not to be critical of what students were wearing, but reminded them that some of what they are wearing was not appropriate for school. Of course there was the explicit warning, kind of father-like, to cease and desist wearing the types of clothes in violation of the code which, if ignored, would implicitly lead to consequences.

Many students made a point of commenting how much they appreciated my comments and supported the efforts to remind students of their dress. With all the positive feedback from our kids I almost let my guard down a bit, and allowed a little smugness to seep in over such a well-crafted announcement! I should have known better! I've been doing this a long time. It took a little freshman to bring me back to reality.


Her question was innocent enough, but its significance cannot be overstated. It went something like this: "How do I know when my dress is not appropriate for school if it is appropriate at other times"? She was very serious and any residual smugness I had evaporated immediately. It struck me how confusing it is for young people. They live in a world that was initially shaped by a cultural revolution of the sixties and a battle cry of "anything goes" (including clothing, or the lack thereof) and being reshaped by a counter-cultural reaction to restructure how we act, how we think, and how we believe.

At either end of these ideological cultural poles, there is no shared belief of what is “appropriate.” At either end of these cultural ideological poles it is “all or nothing.” I have never been comfortable at either extremes of thought and I suspect most people feel the same. I think the concept of “appropriate” lies in the area between these two forces and define those beliefs we hold in common. Of course the next question is do we hold any beliefs in common? I would like to believe we do! There is a way to dress for school that lies somewhere between a day at the beach and uniforms.

Our young people need these types of conversations to help narrow their understanding of “appropriate” for all situations. To truly appreciate and understand the great freedoms we hold, and to be fair to our young people, we need to find ways to establish and support commonly accepted boundaries or limits, yet encourage individual expression and creativity within those boundaries. In some ways I think it is our greatest responsibility to our students!

I hope that this Branching Out finds you and your family in good health and enjoying our wonderful spring weather!

- Keeps promises, and thinks through problems and develops alternatives

These can be nurtured at home by encouraging students to practice a skill in a favorite sport, or maintain a practice schedule for a musical instrument. In school, these traits can be reinforced through reading material such as: The Little Engine That Could or in a study of Lincoln's "Gettysburg Address." Other reading material might include: The Helen Keller Story, Breakthrough to the Big League: The Story of Jackie Robinson, Best Friends, and The Red Badge of Courage.

ATTENTION SENIORS AND SENIOR PARENTS
VACCINATE BEFORE YOU GRADUATE CLINIC

All students attending state colleges or universities in the State of Ohio, and living on-campus in student housing, are required to sign a form stating whether or not they have received the meningitis vaccine and hepatitis B vaccine.

The meningitis vaccine (Menactra) will be available to all Roosevelt seniors at the **"VACCINATE BEFORE YOU GRADUATE CLINIC"** sponsored by Kent State University health Services on **MAY 13TH** in Room 514.

The GARDASIL vaccine will also be available for female student wishing to start the vaccination series. GARDASIL is a series of three vaccines that helps protect against diseases caused by the Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) including cervical cancer, abnormal cervical cells, and genital warts. TWO CLASSES REMAINING FOR 2008 DRIVER EDUCATION

The National Driver Training School offers Driver Education as part of our Kent Community Education program. All students, including those who are home-schooled or attend other schools. Are welcome to enroll. All students participating in Drivers Education are responsible to the Kent City School District Student Conduct Code. Students must be 15 years and 5 months of age to attend the classroom and 15 years and 6 months for the "behind the wheel" instruction. This is the law!

Each 3-week session meets six times for "in class" instruction – Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4:45 p.m. through 9:00 p.m., in Room 506 at Roosevelt. Students then individually schedule their 8 hours of "behind-the-wheel" instruction directly with National Driver Training School at 1-888-994-2200. The 24 hours of "in-class" instruction and 8 hours "behind-the-wheel" instructions are required by law.

Fee for the course is \$320.00 payable by check or money order to Kent Community Education. Payment in full is required prior to the first day of class. Please read all dates carefully for your session to be sure that the dates do not interfere with your co-curricular activities. No refunds will be issued after the first class session. If school is cancelled due to emergency for the school, (i.e. snow day, etc.) driver training class is also cancelled. The minimum number of students to hold a class each session is five.

News for Kent parents from Superintendent Joe Giancola

Dear Kent Parents and Friends,

Generally, we think of the rite of spring as a rebirth, a reawakening. We reclaim from Old Man Winter what's ours in our yards, our flowers, and our trees. Spring is a new beginning in nature's cycle.

Ironically, in schools, the rite of spring is a completion, a wrapping-up. Our students are concluding their school year with a battery of tests, to include the Ohio Achievement Test (OAT) in grades three through eight and the Ohio Graduation Test (OGT) in grades ten through twelve. Each year, we anticipate improvement in our test results. The Ohio Department of Education expects it, and the Kent Board of Education hopes for it.

Elementary students complete one grade with the anticipation of the next. Secondary students complete courses and assignments with the hope that they may move on to new studies and courses in the next school year. Report cards are awaited anxiously.

One of schooling's most definitive acts of completion is graduation. Students graduating from kindergarten, 5th, 8th, and 12th grades are parents' greatest sources of pride.

All of the above evidences demonstrate and celebrate students' successes. As parents, teachers and support staff members, we share our students' pride and happiness.

Finally, our Board of Education unveils our new strategic plan at its regular meeting on May 13, 5 p.m., at Longcoy School. I thank everyone on the steering committee who persevered the intense planning effort from October to May. The plan's title, "Building for Tomorrow . . . Our Kids, Our Community, Our World," conveys an upbeat message of hope for our children's future.

In closing, in schools, we complete another school year with confidence. Nevertheless, I warn all families that we stress academic rigor to the very end of the year. For students in grades kindergarten through 11, the rigor continues through June 5. For graduating seniors, it continues through commencement ceremonies on June 1. Let me end by congratulating our seniors on their final act of completion as the Class of 2008!
